

Here is your FREE game of "Faith or Fear Factor".

Just follow the directions below and have FUN!

One day, a good friend of mine asked me what I thought the opposite of faith was. I said, "Unbelief." He said, "I always thought that's what it was, too. But I think it's much deeper than that. I think it's fear." I believe my friend is right. Fear can be incredibly effective in weakening our faith and belief in Jesus. Our kids face the same kinds of fears as we do. They might be on a smaller scale, but they are just as real. Here is a fun Bible review game that will hopefully strengthen their faith and put an end to their fears.

Assembly: Cut out all cards along the black lines. Back the 12 title cards with either the "Faith" cards or the "Fear" cards. Back the 12 point circles with the spider circles. Laminate all the cards so that they will last for a long time. You will also need a bucket or large bowl in which you need to place a bunch of fake play bugs. I noticed that you can purchase a bag of 144 bugs from www.orientaltrading.com. Just log on and type bugs into their search box. You might also be able to purchase these bugs at your local party store. By the way, the slimier they feel, the better!

Set Up: For this game, I use 1 pocket chart (approx. 28" square). (You can find pocket charts at your local teacher supply store or online at www.orientaltrading.com) Place the title cards at the top of the chart, then fill the rest of the chart with the 12 cards with the title of the game showing on each one. "Bury" the point circles in the bug bucket.

How to Play: Divide your children into 2 teams and pick a child to be the scorekeeper. For this game, I have provided you with a short script with which you can introduce the game. Within the script are the directions for the game. I have also provided you with the Bible review questions you will ask each of the players.

Suggestions for Success: Whenever a child comes up to the chart to pick a card, ask him or her to just point to the card and then say that you, the teacher, will be the one who turns it over. I have found this method to be highly successful because I am able to control the suspense as to what is behind the card. Sometimes I turn it over really quickly and other times I wait and build anticipation. This really does promote audience excitement. Also, be dramatic about the bug bucket. The bugs obviously aren't real, but each time a child puts their hand inside you can say things like, "Oooh! That's disgusting!" or "I see one crawling up your sleeve!" The kids will love it!







Script for Introducing the Game:

Our Bible review game today is all about faith. But what is faith anyway? The Bible says in Hebrews 11:1 that "...faith is being sure of what we hope for and certain of what we do not see." Let's think about this definition for a moment.

What are some things you can't see, but you know they are there? (Wait for responses like "air", "gas" and "germs".) That's right. All of those things exist even though we can't see them with our own eyes. We also have faith that they exist. For example, if we didn't believe or have faith that air or oxygen existed, we would all be wearing oxygen masks. Also, many of us take the time to go to the doctor and get vaccinated for different germ carrying diseases. If we didn't believe or have faith that germs existed, there would be no need to go to the doctor.

How about the other part of faith defined in our Bible verse? It says that "...faith is being sure of what we hope for..." Do any of you have any hopes or dreams that you believe will come to pass? (Wait for responses and affirm their hopes and dreams.) Sure! We all have hopes and dreams and some of these hopes are sure to come true. For example, I have a hope and dream to some day go to Heaven where I will live with Jesus forever and ever and be with others who love God, too. This isn't just a hope I have that I *think* will come true. I know *for sure* that it will come true because I have faith in God and what He says about Heaven.

Unfortunately, there are many people in this world who do not have this hope. They are not sure they believe in God and many are actually afraid of dying because they don't know what will happen when they die. Fear can be a very powerful feeling and it can often weaken our faith in God.

So, let's play the game "Faith or Fear Factor" and learn about the kind of faith God wants us to have even when circumstances can be fearful and uncertain.

Our game will be played between 2 teams. Each team will have the chance to send a player up front to our chart filled with "Faith or Fear" cards. The player will pick a card and turn it over. If the card says the word "Faith" then the player earns an automatic 100 points for their team. The player can earn 50 more points if he or she answers the Bible review question correctly. However, if the player picks a card that says "Fear" on it, he or she will have to stick their hand into this bucket of slimy "bugs" (dramatically show the kids the "bugs") and feel around for a coin that will display a number on it which is the points that can be earned if the player answers the Bible review question correctly. The team with the most points at the end of the game, wins!

Get ready to play "Faith or Fear Factor"!
