

UNDERSTANDING THE STORY:

God sent an angel to the city of Nazareth, to a young lady.

- What was the angel's name? What was the young lady's name? What was the man's name that Mary was going to get married to?
- When the angel came in, he told Mary to rejoice (to be glad) and he said that somebody was with Mary. Who did he say was with Mary?

When Mary saw the angel, she was confused and thought about his words.

- The angel Gabriel brought Mary amazing news; that she was going to have a son. What did Gabriel say would be the name of Mary's son?
- The son that Mary was going to have would be somebody very special. Who would He be?

Mary was wondering about this amazing news from the angel.

- Gabriel told Mary that the Holy Spirit (Who is God) would make all of this happen. Gabriel said that with God nothing would be impossible. That means that God can do anything.
- When God speaks and says He's going to do something, does He have the power to make it happen?

God was sending His Son, Jesus, to earth to be the Savior of the world. (Matthew 1:21)

- Was God giving Mary a very important job? What did Mary call herself? (Verse 38) Did Mary love God? Did she trust what God was doing in her life?

SIMPLE TRUTHS:

The angel told Mary that God can do anything. Even what we think is not possible, God can do.

- When something seems really hard or not possible, what should we do? If God wants to do something amazing, does He have the power to do it?
- Can you think of some amazing things that God has already done? (He made the world. Jesus came to earth to be our Savior. He has changed peoples' hearts that used to be full of sin, so that now those people love God, etc.)

Mary loved God and God chose her to do something very special.

- When God looks at the people on earth right now, does He see the people who love Him? Does God ever give people special jobs to do for Him?
- If we love God, do you think that He may give us important things that we can do for Him?
- When God tells us to do something, it will not be the same thing as He had for Mary. What are some things that God might want us to do for Him?

Jesus is the only One who can save us from sin.

- Have you ever asked Jesus to forgive you of your sins? If you want to live for Jesus, you can pray and tell Him that right now, and ask Him to save you.

We should love and obey God every day, because He has special things for our lives.




GABRIEL VISITS MARY ^{THE} CRAFT

1. After making your copies, use scissors to cut out Gabriel.




DURING CLASS INSTRUCTIONS:
